<u>School Book Fees:</u> Annual Student Direct Costs cover the costs of; books, copies and stationery, book rental, art and craft, printing and photocopying, text to parents, 24hr Pupil Personal Accident Insurance. Cost for 2021/22 will be as follows:

- o Junior Infants, Senior Infants, First Class, Second Class, Third Class- €90
- o Fourth Class, Fifth Class, Sixth Class- €85

You will receive a Way2Pay link shortly. Please make payment before school reopens in August. You can make payment in instalments. If you are experiencing significant financial difficulty, please come to Darragh to discuss payment options.

<u>Class Allocation</u>: We will not be able to inform children who their teacher will be for next year until after summer recruitment. We will share the information through our website as soon as we can. There will be two full Junior Infant classes in September and all other class groups, including multi-grades, will proceed to the next grade unchanged.

<u>Summer Camp:</u> Teachers are planning a 1-week Summer Camp for children from Incoming Infants to Third Class which will run from 28th June - 2nd July. We will release more info about this next week.

<u>Parent Association</u>: The Parent Association will release a newsletter shortly. Huge thank you to Alan and Robin from Johnstown Tidy Towns who donated 10 blooming flower pots to brighten up our school yard and support the bees. The Parent Association will be running the pre-loved school uniform exchange again this year. Children can come to school in their own clothes from Monday 13th June to the end of the year.
