

The use of smartphones and other technologies is now a feature of daily life for people of all ages. As you are likely aware, smart devices can particularly expose young children to risk – including exposure to harmful content (violence, explicit language, mature themes), cyberbullying, online predators, scams and many children show signs of genuine addiction to their devices. Research consistently shows that, for children, the risks associated with owning a smartphone, using social media and playing online games far outweigh the potential benefits.

As a school community, parents and educators need to work together to create a culture where parents are informed, empowered and responsible for their children's internet and technology use. There is pressure on parents to purchase smartphones, tablets and consoles. Children feel 'everyone is online except me'. There is strength in numbers. We want to empower parents by uniting you all together to protect our children from being exposed to harm when online.



Please remember that the school is not responsible for children once they pass the school gate at the end of the day.

Parents, we urge you to review your child's road safety practices immediately this is literally a matter of life and death.
