Parent Teacher Meetings:

In January we focus a lot of energy on our Parent Teacher (PT) meetings. PT meetings take place on **Tuesday 20th and Wednesday 21st of January**. A small number of meetings may be held in the mornings before school, that same week. On Monday you will be notified of your 10-minute appointment time.

PT meetings are an opportunity for a constructive conversation with your child's class teacher. The meetings focus on achievements from the year so far and set targets for the months to come.

We expect all meetings will be conducted in a respectful manner. All meetings take place in your child's own classroom. There will be no supervision for children during the meeting and children may not attend the meetings. To ensure smooth running of the timetable, meetings must be kept to 10-minutes. Recording of the meeting is strictly prohibited.

There will be no Study Mates homework club on Tuesday 20th and Wednesday 21st of January as Niamh and Angela are required to carry out their meetings. Primary Pals and Primary Pals Plus will run as normal.

Stay Safe:

We are planning to teach a personal safety education programme called 'Stay Safe' to all classes over the next few weeks. The aim of the Stay Safe programme is to teach children personal safety skills so they can look after themselves in situations which could be upsetting or dangerous. It deals initially with common situations which most children will experience at some stage or other, e.g. getting lost or being bullied. The programme also teaches children the safety skills necessary to protect themselves from physical or sexual abuse and emphasises the importance of telling a trusted adult about any problems they have.

The Stay Safe programme is part of the Social, Personal and Health Education curriculum which all primary schools are required to implement.

Co-operation between parents and teachers is essential to the success of this programme. It is important that parents are aware of the content of the Stay Safe lessons and can discuss the lessons with their children. Your child may bring home worksheets which will inform you on the topics being covered in class and how you can reinforce the messages at home.

Goodness Me Goodness You!

As part of children's learning in the 'Beliefs and religions' strand of Goodness Me! Goodness You!, children are encouraged to participate in a 'Family Project'.

On the week of the 20th of January, children will learn about a concept in school and are asked to investigate this concept from their own perspective, with the help of their family. We will limit all other homework during that week so families can focus on this project.

Upon completion, children return their projects to their class teacher and may present their project to their peers. The 'Family Projects' form the basis of classroom discussions and provide a great opportunity for the children to learn more about themselves and their friends.

To prepare your child for this, we would ask that a parent or guardian complete a **family project** with their child at home. A family project is an activity that requires children and a parent/guardian to sit down and discuss a topic from their own perspective.
